1. How fast can I complete the MSN Women's Health Nurse Practitioner program? You'll complete 42 credits to earn the MSN in Women's Health Nurse Practitioner (WHNP) degree. You can complete the MSN in WHNP program in as little as five semesters on the full-time curriculum plan and seven semesters on the part-time curriculum plan.
